The complaints I have from the three villages within the parish is that extension of the Feastival land is nearer to the villages, i.e. Extending toward the railway line whereas before car parking, whereby more noise and the extended music time of 1am.

Plus the volume of traffic thro the villages, hardly double track in places.

These villages, as a stated above have no pavements, we have residents, with horses, cattle and sheep movement, children , dogs who have to walk in the road, and the traffic is unforebearing.

In addition, it is also well into the farm harvest period and slow moving combines 13 foot wide, tractors etc, are also in the vacinity combined with irrational drivers not use to country roads, it's an accident waiting to happen.

The extra signage, last year helped, but another 5000 will definitely need more policing, extra traffic, speeding vehicles, well in excess of the 30 mph and taking no notice of the signs.

These village lanes are not able to cope with this kind of traffic.

They would be exposed to more noise and light pollution, plus there is the potential for litter and odour – depending on what the proposed use of this extended area is to be.
