#### 4. Appointment of Sub Committees Lowlands and Uplands (Pages 5 - 8)

Included is the political balance on planning sub-committees and the list of members nominated by political groups to sit on the Lowlands Area Planning Sub-Committee and the Uplands Area Planning Sub-Committee.

In previous years the Committee has appointed members to sub-committees based on ward area rather than political proportionality.

The Constitution (Part 3C) states that both sub-committees must have a minimum of 11 members, with the Chair of the Development Control Committee being appointed to both sub-committees.

Based on the nominations received from political groups, if the Committee agrees to appoint members to sub-committees based on ward area rather than political proportionality and the Committee elects a Chair who represents a ward in the uplands area, there will only be 10 members appointed to the Uplands Sub-Committee. In this scenario the Committee would be recommended to agree an additional recommendation 7.

Additional recommendation 7:

7. Request that the Constitution Working Group revisits the rule on the sizes of the planning sub-committees.

### Annex A: Political Balance on Planning Sub-Committees

The tables below set out the political proportionalities on the lowlands and uplands subcommittees if these sub-committee were to be appointed based on political balance rather than ward representation. The total number of seats on the two sub-committees is 25 which assumes that the Chair of the Development Control Committee would be appointed to both sub-committees, as in previous years.
