Y	Ubico have review its policy on the use of pesticides and herbicides. They considered alternative methods of weed control and to include products such as New Way and Finalsan. However, officers completed extensive research on the options and associated costs, and established that locally the quantities applied on Council owned land had been reduced to 12 litres per season at a cost of circa £200. Changing to alternatives like New Way and Finalsan would cost between £7-10k a year. Treatments only take place in public car parks, Depots, and at Woodgreen and not in playgrounds or open spaces.
