				The Council is aware that remedial works are required to bring the pitches back to a football suitable surface, this was confirmed through an independent grounds maintenance inspection that the Council commissioned. Officers are currently looking into appropriate funding to undertake the required works. But to secure this facility going forward the Leisure and Assets teams are investigating the possibility of a short-term lease to the school – to align with the covenant on the site, which specifies no transfer or sale until 2029. This will enable the school to reactivate community bookings and take on responsibility for the operations at the site. Officers are due to meet with the school shortly to take this discussion forward.
