#### I. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1.1 A trial permitting long stay in Zone G at Woolgate car park has been underway since June 2022. This is 148 spaces of the car park. The trial was initiated to support customers who work locally by permitting longer stays in standard spaces. The trial has proven successful, and we now seek to make this a permanent change.

#### 2. BACKGROUND

- 2.1 Executive met on the 11 October 2023, and gave delated authority to the Assistant Director for Resident Services Group in consultation with the Executive Member for Leisure and Major Projects to authorise the change in the WODC Parking Order.
- **2.2** To make these changes we need to make a Variation Order, where there is provision for public & statutory consultation.
